

Praying the Psalms



This year the participants in the Friends of Jesus and the Interfaith programs will be studying eighteen of the one hundred and fifty psalms in the Book of Psalms. Each time we meet we will read a particular psalm and discuss the particular theme and lessons of the psalm. To help us grow in our relationship with Jesus, we will memorize at least one line which we can use as a short prayer.

Our goal is to learn how to use the psalms as another form of prayer. The first verse that we memorized was from psalm 107:1 "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever." This verse is a prayer of praise and thanksgiving. We talked about the many things that we experience in our world for which we could thank God. It is inspiring to listen to the participants pray with such sincere hearts. They are aware of what is happening in the world and realize how good God is to His people. One participant pointed out that even though bad things have happened recently, good people have offered to help people they don't even know.

It is our hope that by learning a few key verses from the psalms, our participants will grow in their relationship with the Lord. Each small group has made a Psalm Box which is placed in the center of their group circle. When they gather after the large group session, the psalm verse for the lesson is recited in a variety of ways and then placed in the Psalm Box. Each week the verses will be pulled out of the box and used as the opening prayer.

After only having four lessons, the participants are able to pray the four verses they have learned. If someone begins the first few words the entire group chimes in to complete the verse. Our goal is to help the participants see that using the psalms for prayer can draw us closer to God and help us to understand His deep love for each one of us.






In Memory of...

I was fortunate to have known both of these women. As I reflected on my encounters with Marilyn and Loretta, I simply felt blessed to have known them. Both Marilyn and Loretta were gentle, loving, and deeply faith-filled women. They loved the Lord and had a fervent desire to share His love with others.

Marilyn will be remembered for her infectious smile and tenacious zest for life. Very little prevented Marilyn from having a good day. She will best be known for being a faithful advocate for people with disabilities: an active member of the Special Religious Education program, a weekly Interfaith participant with her daughter Martha, a volunteer on the Special Education Committee from 2006-2012, and a reliable helper with weekly sessions and special social events. In addition, she was one of the co-founders of the JRC program. Marilyn was my inspiration during the Interfaith sessions on Tuesday nights. I could always count on her words of encouragement and affirmation. Her beautiful smile, deep faith, infectious spirit, and zest for life will truly be missed.

Whenever I was in the presence of Loretta, I always felt an indescribable peace. Loretta's personality overflowed with gentleness, kindness, and a loving demeanor. Her love for the Lord was deep and her faith strong. Sharing her faith and love of the Lord was a huge part of her life.

Loretta was actively involved in the early formation of the Special Education Program. She served on the Wauertown Catechetical Board from 1974-77 took a short break, returned in 1986-1994 and again in 2004-2006. Loretta and Joseph Erdner continued their support of people with disabilities as benefactors by contributing to our annual appeal.

I pray that Marilyn and Loretta will now enjoy their eternal reward. We will all miss these two exceptionally good and faithful servants of the Lord who have touched our hearts with their loving and gentle spirits.
